MARK PRESTON SPEAKS ON WORKPLACE EFFICIENCY



Mark Preston Lean Principles

Mark Preston, private consultant and native Griffinite, ascribes to the principles of the Lean Enterprise Institute in helping his clients maximize customer value while minimizing waste. Preston shared the five-step thought process in implementing lean techniques in the workplace as: (1) Specify value from the view of the customer; (2) Identify value streams from supplier to the customer; (3) Identify and eliminate waste so that product will flow smoothly toward the customer; (4) As flow is established, allow customers to create pull value for products, and; (5) Continue to seek a state of perfection in the process. Preston's approach with his clients is to assess and transform in the production arena as well as in business office operations. He looks to improving efficiency with motion, processing, inventory, and other improvements for businesses. He uses a number of tools in this process including introspective assessments and even a Lego recreation of the workplace to study improved flow and motion. He is openly excited about the prospects of improved business and manufacturing in the U.S. "In 2015, we should expect to see a break-even level of manufacturing between the U.S. and China," he added.


