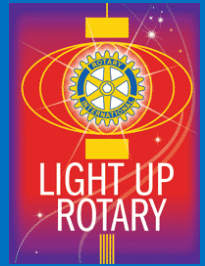

When asked to select a long word from a page in a book, Mark “sensed” the word was mountainside. It was actually mountainview. There were other ooohhh’s and aaaahhh’s from the audience as he could recall details on the text of certain pages in one of his favorite books, *The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes*, and when he completed his magic square for the number 44 in which every column, row, diagonal, and other combinations of the blocks within his square added to 44. Johnson also showed his lifelong love of Rotary in sharing that Rotary is a way of life and not just a service club. He encouraged Rotarians to, “Look at the really big picture. Rotary is doing really significant things around the world each and every day.” Mark also used the example of Jim the Wonder Dog who, even as an older dog, showed that he was amazingly psychic. He encouraged everyone to read more about Jim.
