
22 ROTARIANS BOOST THEIR FOUNDATION GIVING





"In Warsaw, Wojciech Sierpinski, a Rotary Club President, took me on a tour that I will never forget. We visited his parent's house - where they lived during World War II. There in the kitchen, under a dusty stack of crates was a secret wood panel in the floor. Wojciech removed the panel to reveal a tiny room underneath the kitchen floor where his parents hid their neighbors - a Jewish family - during the war. As I stood speechless, listening to Wojciech describe how they evaded the Nazis, I realized the full value of the Group Study Exchange program."
